




Your first stop for research!

Search TMU and university libraries across Ontario



Omni, is the library's new academic search tool, that allows you to simultaneously search across 19 different Ontario university libraries and access over 25 million material items.


You can pin or share items you find, save searches, and generate citations in different formats. You can request to borrow books located in other university libraries and they will be delivered to TMU.






Types of Sources: Scholarly versus Popular

Scholarly

- Examples: academic books, journals
- Written by experts, for experts
- Include references
- Written in a formal manner
- Typically long e.g., 20 pages
- Often "peer-reviewed"
- The purpose is academic: to discuss research, to critique, to educate academic peers



Libraries

Popular

- Examples: magazines, newspapers
- The writers and audience aren't necessarily subject experts (e.g., journalist writing for a newspaper)
- Less formal writing
- Tend to be short
- Limited use of references (may quote experts)
- Could be written for any non-academic purpose, including entertainment

Searching for a specific kind of resource

I'm looking for a recent newspaper article about the effect of US tariffs on the global economy I want to watch Alien Romulus

Searching by Subject - In depth

If you don't find what you're looking for or what is available, there are other options


- Every subject has specific subject databases
- Subject databases include articles, data and other information, some of which is not included/not easy to find in the main search
- Find the best databases for your subject/topic by looking at the libraries' research guides or the <u>full list</u> of databases




Searching by Subject: Activity








Technology Resources + Fabrication




Access 3D printers, laser cutters, digital embroidery machines and more.
